


# THE CALGARY RUGBY UNION (CRU) AND RESULTS CENTRE



### **12. TOURNAMENT RULES**

**12.1** It is incumbent upon all coaches and participants to be aware of ASAA Rugby policy and World Rugby rule variations. Specifically for this event, player eligibility (pp. 27-32) and ASAA Rugby rule variations (p. 80) and policy (pp. 80-86) of the <u>ASAA 2023-24 Handbook</u>.

**12.2 Discipline and Misconduct:** Breaches of the ASAA Code of Ethics are treated seriously, and as host, [we] are required to report any breaches to the ASAA office where action may occur. A portion of the ASAA Code of Ethics states "Any conduct including, but not limited to, ejections, fighting, drug, alcohol or cannabis use, that results in dishonor to the athlete, the team, the school or the ASAA during an ASAA provincial championship event will not be tolerated." (pp. 21-25). Any unsportsmanlike or violent behavior (e.g. fighting) that results in an ejection of an athlete or coach from play in an ASAA provincial championship competition shall result in a suspension from the next scheduled match of the current season, where match is understood to mean game, match, round, bout, etc. as appropriate per sport.

**12.3 Discipline/Appeal Committee:** All ASAA provincial championship hosts will convene a discipline/appeal committee. The committee will have the authority to address issues of a serious nature that may occur before, during or after a provincial championship match, or to hear appeals of the automatic suspension resulting from an ejection. The committee may include, but not be limited to, the tournament chairperson, an official, and two coaches not in conflict with the issue.

**12.4 Uniform Policy:** Please refer to ASAA rugby policy Uniforms A.i and ii on page 86 of the <u>ASAA 2023-24 Handbook</u>

**12.5 Competition Site Security and Coaching Zone:** For each playing field there will be one side designated for teams and one for spectators. Spectators may not view the game from within the team areas, nor may coaches or players view the game from the designated spectator areas. If a coach wants to sit in the spectator area, he/she must do so for the entire match and must not enter the team area until the competition has concluded. Communication to coaches/players from outside the team area is prohibited (this includes headphones, two-way radios, etc.). This type of team management strategy is outside the spirit of the game. Designated trainers are permitted on or around the field as the needs of the players warrant. Teams/coaches will have a designated area during the game. Coaches are not to leave this area. Coaches are not allowed on the field except during half time. If the need arises the referee will call the coach onto the field. Water may be provided to the on-field players by designated water carriers. The number of carriers may not exceed three. These persons must not be dressed in uniform.

Substitution players may run water as long as they wear pinnies to identify that they are not currently playing.

Allocated Coach, Player, and Spectator Zones Map (a larger map will be provided in the coaching packages)

**12.6 Replacement of Players (substitution):** There shall be 19 players on the tournament team roster (See next Page), and 14 players listed on the game sheet (5 players will remain on reserve for the duration of the game - only the 14 on the game sheet are eligible to play in that particular game) SECTION XVI – RUGBY. p. 80-81, Section XVI, Eligibility 3.8. Before each match ateam must nominate 14 players on a game sheet that indicates name, unique jersey number or letter, and captain(s) as per World Rugby law 3 (Sevens Variation). Only players on the game sheet may play, with a maximum of 5 substitutions. U-19 Variation 3.14 - A player who has been substituted may replace an injured player. At each field of play there will be scorekeepers that will collect team rosters before the match. All substitutions must be initiated through the scorekeeper not through the referee. Substitutions can occur at any time during the game however there is a maximum of 5 substitutions per team per game.

\*Please note: any player who requires a permanent replacement due to injury shall not return to the match. A player may be temporarily replaced due to a blood injury, but must be returned immediately after the bleeding is controlled or covered. This must occur within 10 minutes (for shortened game) from actual time of leaving the playing field or the replacement becomes permanent as an injury replacement.

**12.7 Games:** All games will last 14 minutes – two 7 minute halves and a 5 minute half-time break. ALL WARM-UPS are to be held outside of the in goal areas, the other fields are not intended for warm ups as they are in use by regular scheduled games of the CRU.Please do not use these spaces.

**Yellow Cards:** Length of Yellow Cards: When a player is being cautioned and suspended for two minutes, the referee will show that player a yellow card. If that player later commits another yellow-card offense, the player must be sent off.

# **GAMEPLAY & RULES**

**12.8 Protests:** Protests concerning results or conduct within an event must be made within 30 minutes of the results being posted or announced. The protest must be made to the Grievance Chairs: Angie Seaman and Brent Gough. The Discipline Committee comprises the Head Referee, a Grievance Chair, and the Technical Chair. The Discipline Committee will deliberate, a decision will be rendered, and then shared with the protesting individuals. Recognition of urgency will be made to decide the next scheduled match of any team involved with or included in the protest. Any response to the decision will be heard immediately, and the Discipline Committee may alter the decision. At this point the Committee's decision will stand (to move on with the competition and the tournament resolution) and any appeals must be filed with the ASAA Provincial Rugby Commissioner of the corresponding gender. Appeals will be documented and used constructively toward improved equity, sportsmanship, and general fairness if and where these things may be found lacking.

12.9 Sportsmanship: One sportsmanship banner and Perpetual Plague will be given to both Girls and Boys teams/The team receiving this award will represent the true spirit of sportsmanship, integrity, ethics and fair play. Each team present at Provincials will be asked to select a team that best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship throughout the competition. Coaches will be sent a link to the Team Nomination Form. This will provide coaches with the ability to nominate a team based on their team's decision. The rationale in having the teams select the award winner is that they interact with one another throughout the two-day event and will have the best insight into which teams are truly sportsmanlike. Teams will vote for one team and the Host will tally the votes on Saturday before the end of the competition. The final decision is at the discretion of the ASAA rep and the Committee Chair. Sportsmanship keychains will be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play, and good sportsmanship. These awards may be given to players, coaches, parents, and spectators. These individuals should be recognized for bringing a positive presence to the championship and demonstrating consistent exemplary sportsmanlike behavior.

**12.10 Tournament Rugby Game Balls:** The ASAA office is working on finalizing a contract with Rhino Rugby to be the official rugby ball of the ASAA as there is no sponsorship by Gilbert this year. While the deal with Rhino is being negotiated, Rhino has agreed to provide game balls to the Rugby Sevens and Rugby XV Provincial Championships. As such, the hosts will be supplying the Rhino Comet Match Ball, and not Gilbert, as the ball used at the 2024 Rugby Championships. However, the ASAA respects that, currently, Gilbert is the official ball in rugby policy and that schools have likely been using a Gilbert ball throughout this season. Therefore, teams may request to use a Gilbert ball at the Provincial Championships. If a team requests to use a Gilbert ball, that request will be granted (provided the teams supply new Gilbert Barbarian balls) regardless of if the other team prefers to use the Rhino.

**12.11 Athletic Therapy Services:** Athletic therapy services will be provided on-site. The paid personnel will be there for emergency injury assessment and treatment (or treatment recommendations). Each field will have an athletic therapist on-site throughout the tournament to go on the field to assist in injury assessment and treatment. They are not expected to provide taping, massage therapy or any other responsibilities typically associated with team trainers. Teams must bring their tape and supplies. There will be a Medical Tent that team athletic therapists or trainers, players, and coaches can access.

**12.12 Change Rooms and Washroom Facilities:** There are washrooms available in the Clubhouse and building beside the main tent. <u>Change rooms are available in the building beside the main tent</u>. Please do not leave your belongings unattended. Please do not wear cleats through the main area of the clubhouse. Changing in the main area of the clubhouse or the washrooms is not permitted.

**12.13 Lightning Rule:** The guidelines noted on the Safety Guidelines for Secondary Interschool Athletics will be followed. If in doubt, follow the 30-30 rule: 30 seconds: Count the seconds between seeing lightning and hearing thunder. If this time is less than 30 seconds, lightning is still a potential threat. Seek shelter Immediately. 30 minutes: After the last lightning flash, wait 30 minutes before leaving shelter. Half of all lightning deaths occur after a storm passes. Stay in a safe area until you are sure the threat has passed.

### AWARDS

In accordance with ASAA tradition, Team Sportsmanship Awards will be presented by the ASAA to the recipient school shortly after the competition at an agreed upon date between the school and the ASAA.

### ASAA TEAM PHOTOGRAPHS

The ASAA requires team photographs for the yearbook. These will all be submitted on the <u>google registration form</u>. We ask that players wear team jerseys with visible numbers for yearbook and reporting purposes. Team photos will be taken before each tier's awards are presented at FIELD 5.

### **GRIEVANCE / DISCIPLINE / SPORTSMANSHIP COMMITTEE**

There are two key functions of the Grievance/Discipline Committee at ASAA provincials. The first function is to deal with matters that occur during competition, typically discipline/conduct issues, and appeals that may arise from ejections. The second function is to handle any other matters that arise that require dispute resolution. These three members will form the committee with Angie McCullough (Grievance Chair), the Head Official (TBD as appointed by the RAMOA) and a coach from a team that has no interest in the outcome.

### **OFFICIALS and MINOR OFFICIALS**

Tournament officials are supplied through the RUGBY ALBERTA MINOR OFFICIALS ASSOCIATION (RAMOA). The tournament assignor will be present at the coaches meeting to review any specific areas of attention for game conduct.

**Minor Officials:** each scorekeeping table will be managed by volunteer scorekeepers. If you have a concern with the score please address it through the Officials - the head referee has the official score. Do not direct comments to the minor officials (touch judges or the scorekeepers).

Please remember that ALL officials must be respected at all times.

### **SPORTSM ANSHIP**

Sportsmanship "Set the Bar" keychains will be given in recognition of any sportsmanlike conduct displayed by anyone in attendance at the provincial events. If you would like to nominate someone for a keychain please notify the facility manager or committee member. Team Sportsmanship will be evaluated throughout the tournament by coaches, officials and sportsmanship committee members. Winners of the Girls and Boys Team Sportsmanship Award will receive both a plaque and banner following the tournament and presented at their home school by a member of the ASAA.
